WHEREAS, the Village has not authorized a new agreement for the collection and disposal of solid waste services.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS

RESOLVED, that the Mayor is authorized temporarily to continue in effect the services of Meadow Carting Corp. upon the same terms and conditions until such time as the Village has entered into a new agreement for the collection and disposal of solid waste pursuant to law, provided, however, that temporary services shall not continue after July 1, 2021, until further authorized by the Board of Trustees.

| 22 | been doing. Obviously they've been doing |
| 23 | residual storm cleanup. They have been doing |
| 24 | snow removal. They continue to sweep village |

streets -- and I'm sure that's going to continue -- and cleaning up after all the storms that we've had.

A little bit of truck maintenance, streetlight repair, a lot of picking up of branches due to wind storms, a lot of moving of salt. We've had a lot of icing on the road. And there are two resident's requests which are for streetlights.

And they also obviously were busy loading up the debris from the storm in the Dumpster. They will continue with sweeping the village streets. They will continue with increasing the wattage, if you will, along Shorewood to Highland. And snow removal if needed. Maybe not. Maybe we're past this. And start spring clean up.

Once again we're going to do it on the record. Burt was -- significantly pointed out at the last meeting, and we're going to repeat it at this meeting, obviously the Public Works Department did a phenomenal job --

TRUSTEE WESTON: They did.

MAYOR WEINBERG: -- with our snow removal and keeping our streets free of ice so people were able to move about relatively soon after the storm. Storms. Plural.

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MAYOR WEINBERG: New Business. The

Manhasset -- well, the Water Pollution

Control District inquired. We have it in the script as The Water Authority of Great Neck

North --

MAYOR WEINBERG: -- but it's actually the Water Pollution Control District inquired about the possibility of I guess purchasing road salt with the village. Apparently they've been -- one of the commissioners approached me and told me that they've been buying salt by the -- I guess by the 5-pound can because they don't use that much of it. It's certainly not cost effective. But they use it obviously for their front stoop and sidewalk and for their parking lot.

And essentially what they need is one

truckload. They have their own truck. They just need to load it up with salt. So they would pay a fee that we would negotiate that would cover the cost of the salt, the cost of loading up their truck and an administrative fee just to share in the burden of storing it and ordering it. It would probably work out cheaper for them than ordering it from Home Depot by the can.

So if that is acceptable to the parties, we can negotiate an agreement. I look forward to presenting you with an IMA, an intermunicipal agreement, that would accomplish that task.

It wouldn't interfere with our snow removal operations because the loading of their truck would occur before the event.

They would not -- because they use so little, they don't need to reload during the event.

They probably won't even need to reload after the event.

And given the size of the storage, the amount of salt we have on hand, it would not put the Village in a position where we would

not -- the Village would not have sufficient 1 salt. We wouldn't run out of salt during any 2 3 event. So -- and we have a contract where we are required to take delivery of salt at 4 5 several times during the season. So I just wanted to give you that highlight of an item 6 7 to come. 8 There is a deposit refund. Denise, what is -- I'll make the motion. 9 10 RESOLVED, that the refunds of deposits in 11 the aggregate amount of \$2,387.00 (as itemized on the Abstract of Refunds dated 12 13 Monday, March 8, 2021), are hereby approved 14 for disbursement from the Trust and Agency 1.5 Fund. 16 Is there a second? 17 DEPUTY MAYOR SHARKEY: I'll make a 18 second. 19 MAYOR WEINBERG: And, Denise, what is 20 this refund for? 21 VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR KNOWLAND: That is 22 for a deposit we took for a building permit in a commercial building on Northern 23 24 Boulevard: 805 Northern Boulevard.
