MAYOR WEINBERG: This is for informational purposes - this is a surety bond. This is not an insurance coverage, which the Village has, which obviously provide for much higher limits of liability. Anything you want to add?

TRUSTEE PANG: What's the difference

Board of Trustees - April 12, 2021 between insurance corporation and this 1 2 one? 3 MAYOR WEINBERG: I'm glad you asked. 4 That's my entire career. I will answer 5 the question, but Denise, would you please briefly just remind the Board what our 6 7 insurance limits are. 8 MS. KNOWLAND: I don't have the 9 insurance limits handy with me. 10 Unfortunately, I don't have the book with 11 me. 12 MAYOR WEINBERG: We will report back 13 to the Board on that. But on our general 14 liability insurance coverage we do -- I 15 believe we do have computer crime coverage 16 which is a different source of coverage, 17 different from the surety. 18 An insurance policy is between the 19 insurance company and the Village. And if 20 there is any personal injury, property 21 damage, computer crime that occurs, it is 22 subject to a claim by the Village against 23 the insurance company. 24 A surety bond is different than the

insurance policy. A surety bond is a

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three-party agreement. It is between the represented principle, which in this case is for the Village -- for the signatories to the bank account. So it's between the principal who is the signatory to the bank account, the surety company and the Village that if anyone of the principals steals monies from the accounts, that the Village would make a claim to the surety company. It's just a different form of agreement. It's not the same as insurance. There may also be insurance coverage, but it's specifically required by law in order to provide what is called "dishonesty coverage" for certain public employees.

TRUSTEE PANG: Got it. Thank you.

MAYOR WEINBERG: And the essential

difference between a surety contract as

compared to an insurance policy, is the

insurance policy is a two-party contract;

a surety is a three-party contract. Any

other questions or discussion? Did we
