to the repair shop it was not -- it could not start due to failure of the batteries, necessitating an emergency expenditure of \$461.24 to remediate the inability to start the truck engine, and

WHEREAS, during the course of the ensuing repairs to the differential, the following additional necessary work was identified:

brake replacement and resurfacing of the brake drums, New York State diesel emissions inspection and New York State inspection due, all in the total amount of \$696.70 in addition to the previously authorized repair costs, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees finds and concluded that the foregoing unanticipated expenses are reasonable and necessary under the circumstances and were required to be authorized in advance of approval from the Board of Trustes.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees hereby ratifies the emergency action of the Mayor in authorizing the aforesaid additional

22	related to COVID-19.
23	The upcoming work will include emergency
24	work related to COVID-19, police village

streets, picking up branches, trimming trees, continued street sign repair, finishing up sidewalk work and continuing spring cleanup work at the island and entrance signs and at Village Hall.
