I am Frank Faber. 11 I'm one of the partners here at Skinnon & 12 Faber. 13 Skinnon & Faber was hired to do the audit 14 for the financial statements for the fiscal 15 year ended February 28, 2021, as well as to 16 assist and file the New York State annual 17 update document. That document was, in fact, 18 filed with the state on May 3rd. So that has been completed. The audit is complete. And 19 20 we have presented to the Board a draft of 21 those statements. Upon approval from the 22 Board we are in a position to finalize and 23 issue our report. 24 I would direct your attention to Page 1

of the report. Which as an auditor, that's my big moment. We're hired to express an opinion. Our opinion is that the financial statements for the Village of Thomaston are, in fact, in accordance with current accounting pronouncements. All appropriate disclosures and statements are attached as of — as I said, for the year ended February 28th of 2021.

I would encourage the Board, since we are in draft, any comments, questions, no matter how small perhaps, you know, let us know in terms of formatting and such before we finalize. Certainly we encourage those comments, any questions or uncertainties as well.

The management discussion and analysis is at the beginning of the report. Particularly page 7 kind of explains some of the variances between the budget and actual. There were some significant variances simply because — primarily because of the situation, COVID, some projects were not undertaken this year. So there were some expenditures that were

1	budgeted for that and did not occur during
2	the year. And there's some detail and
3	explanation regarding that on page 7.
4	As I said, we are issuing a clean
5	opinion. And if there are any questions or
6	any further explanation that you would like
7	to have, I will stay on.

24	Attorney with respect to the proposed law.

Upon the motion of 1 2 Steve Weinberg: 3 RESOLVED, that the Board hereby finds and concludes that 4 The proposed action (Bill T2021C.1) 5 is an unlisted action under the State 6 7 Environmental Quality Review Act and its 8 regulations; The Board is the lead agency with 9 10 respect to environmental review of this 11 proposed action; (c) The Board has considered the 12 13 following factors and made the following 14 conclusions in respect to its review of the 15 environmental impacts of the proposed action: 16 The proposed action is adoption of a 17 local law to authorize applications to be 18 made for incentive zoning permits. The Board 19 is not required to grant any such application. And the incentive zoning use is 20 21 not an as of right use. Because this 2.2 proposed action only allows an application to 23 be made and does not itself authorize any use 24 of property, the proposed law has no
