WHEREAS, the New York State Environmental Conservation Law and the regulations of the Department of Environmental Conservation as contained in 6 NYCRR Part 617 require review of the possible environmental consequences of various actions under consideration by the Board of Trustees; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees is considering the adoption of legislation designated Bill T2020B, a local law amending the code of the Village of Thomaston regarding the definition of floor area ratio;

and

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WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees has reviewed the proposed local law T2020B and a Short Environmental Assessment Form prepared by the village attorney with respect thereto,

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS

RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees hereby finds and concludes that it is the Lead Agency for environmental impact review of Bill 2020B pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act and regulations adopted pursuant thereto (collectively referred to hereinafter as "SEQRA"); and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees hereby determines that the proposed adoption of Bill 2020B is an unlisted action as defined in SEQRA; and it is further

RESOLVED, that having given full consideration to the proposed local law, and the Short Environmental Assessment Form prepared in relation thereto, the Board of Trustees hereby finds and concludes as follows:

(i) the proposed action would not result 1 in any substantial adverse change in existing 2 3 air quality, ground or surface water quality or quantity, traffic or noise levels, or any 4 5 substantial increase in solid waste production, nor create a substantial increase 6 7 in the potential for erosion, flooding, 8 leaching or drainage problems; (ii) the proposed action would not result 9 10 in the removal or construction of large 11 quantities of vegetation or fauna, substantial interference with the movement of 12 13 any resident or migratory fish or wildlife 14 species, impacts on a significant habitat 1.5 area, substantial adverse impacts on a 16 threatened endangered species of animal or 17 plant, or the habitat of such a species, or 18 other significant adverse impacts to natural 19 resources; 20 (iii) the proposed action would not 21 impair the environmental characteristics of 2.2 any critical environmental area; 23 (iv) the proposed action would not 24 conflict with the community's current plans

or goals as officially approved or adopted; 1 (v) the proposed action would not impair 2 3 the character or quality of important historical, archaeological, architectural or 4 5 aesthetics resources or of an existing community or neighborhood character; 6 7 (vi) the proposed action would not result 8 in a major change in the use of either the 9 quantity or type of energy; 10 (vii) the proposed action would not 11 create a substantial change in the use or 12 intensity of use of land, including 13 agricultural, open space or recreational 14 resources, or in its capacity to support 1.5 existing uses; (viii) the proposed action would not 16 17 encourage or attract large numbers of persons 18 to any place for more than a few days, 19 compared to the number who would come to such 20 place without such action; 21 (ix) the proposed action would not create 2.2 changes in two or more elements of the environment, no one of which would have a 23 24 significant impact on the environment, but
