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MAYOR WEINBERG: Good evening. My name 1 2 is Steve Weinberg, Mayor of the Village of 3 Thomaston. And this is a Special Meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Village of 4 5 Thomaston. I thank everyone for their patience while 6 7 we work through some technical difficulties 8 and make sure everyone was able to join. 9 Since we're conducting this meeting via Zoom 10 -- it is now 7:44 p.m. And I will read the 11 following statement. 12 Due to the public health and safety 13 concerns related to COVID-19, and pursuant to 14 New York State law, this meeting of the Board 15 of Trustees is not being held in person. The 16 board is meeting by videoconferencing. The 17 meeting will be recorded and a transcription 18 will be provided at a later date. 19 The public has the opportunity to observe this meeting live online and to submit 20 21 comments pursuant to instructions given on 22 the village website and in the meeting notice. 23 24 The Village Administrator will now call

22	MAYOR WEINBERG: Before we begin, I will
23	be considering a motion. There has been a
24	request that has been made to the village, to

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myself as the mayor, to recuse myself from any and all proceedings in any way relating to the Landmark Commission.

I have certainly consulted and reviewed the matter with the Village Attorney. And without disclosing obviously what was discussed with the Village Attorney, the basic standard is whether or not it is discretionary with the Mayor.

And I want to just say that there is no doubt in my mind, as with the underlying application, anything with respect to the Landmark Commission that the -- I personally do not have a conflict of interest. I held the village and the village's needs and interest as my guiding standard of any decision that I would make.

18There is no statutory or regulation that19requires me to recuse myself. And I can20certainly tell you and everyone that I will21keep an open mind throughout this process.22And after the Landmark Commission makes its23recommendation, conducts the review with the24Board of Trustees, with the public at a

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public meeting, and will certainly make any decision with respect to reviewing the Landmark Commission's recommendations with an open mind. I have not made any decision or pre-determination with respect to any of these matters that will come up. And I will certainly continue to work in that light.

With that in mind the -- yesterday there was a meeting of the Landmarks Preservation Commission. And the purpose of the meeting of the Landmarks Preservation Commission was -- is to -- was to retain a consultant in order to aid the Landmarks Preservation Commission with respect to their review at a public meeting in making a recommendation with respect to whether what is commonly known as "Tower Ford" should be landmarked, and under the landmark statute under what findings and what should be made with respect to a landmark determination regarding the exterior of the building. The minutes will speak for themselves. But the -- but Mr. Stern had certainly

reviewed and requested the -- at least

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something in the neighborhood of
approximately 10 consultants. They received
three. And the consultants were requested
from the Preservation Long Island, the New
York State Parks Recreation and Historic
Preservation and also from the Village
Attorney as to who the consultants were that
worked in this area.

There is one consultant that the Landmarks Preservation Commission wishes to retain. They have retained them. And it is subject to the Board to authorize the payment for the consultant that the Landmarks Preservation Commission wishes to utilize in reviewing the recommendation -- in preparing their recommendations. On that basis I would like to make the following motion:

18WHEREAS, the Landmarks Preservation19Commission held a public meeting on November2030, 2021, to consider retention of a21consultant to advise the Commission in22connection with their duties to determine23whether or not 124 S. Middle Neck Road, Great24Neck, New York 11021 and also known as

Section 2, Block 250, Lots 5 and 25, be 1 designated a landmark in the Village of 2 3 Thomaston, and WHEREAS, the Commission has the power to 4 5 retain consultants, including but not limited 6 to technical experts, engineers, architects 7 and historians, to render assistance and 8 advice in connection with any project to fulfill the duties of the Landmarks 9 10 Preservation Commission, and 11 WHEREAS, retention of a consultant which 12 involves the expenditure of village funds 13 subject to the approval of the Board of 14 Trustees, and 15 WHEREAS, the Commission reviewed three 16 proposals from Archaeology & Historic 17 Resources Services, LLC, also known as AHRS, 18 Cashin Spinelli & Ferretti, LLC, and Simeon 19 Bankoff, and 20 WHEREAS, the Commission selected to 21 retain the services of archaeology and 22 historic resources (Audio distortion) VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR KNOWLAND: We lost 23 24 the audio, Mayor Weinberg. You're not --

TRUSTEE WESTON: Steve, we lost you. 1 TRUSTEE MONOSON: Can't hear you. 2 3 MAYOR WEINBERG: It is further RESOLVED --4 5 TRUSTEE MONOSON: We lost the audio. 6 TRUSTEE WESTON: Steve, you have to go back. We lost audio after the "WHEREAS" 7 regarding the three proposals. 8 9 (Whereupon, there is a brief pause in the 10 proceedings.) 11 MAYOR WEINBERG: Okay. Can you hear me 12 okay? 13 TRUSTEE WESTON: Yeah. Now we can. 14 VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR KNOWLAND: Yes. 15 MAYOR WEINBERG: I'm sorry. Where did it 16 leave off? TRUSTEE WESTON: We lost -- WHEREAS, the 17 18 Commission reviewed three proposals from 19 Archaeology & Historic Resources, Cashin 20 Spinelli & Ferretti and Simeon Bankoff. 21 MAYOR WEINBERG: And 22 WHEREAS, the Commission selected to retain the services of Archaeology & Historic 23 24 Resources Services, LLC

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT 1 RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees 2 3 hereby approves the expenditure of Village funds in the amount not to exceed \$6,000, for 4 5 the retention of Archaeology & Historic Resources Services, LLC, by the Landmarks 6 Preservation Commission. And it is further 7 8 RESOLVED, that the Village Administrator shall advise the Landmarks Preservation 9 10 Commission of the Board's approval of 11 funding. 12 Okay. Is there a second on the 13 resolution? 14 DEPUTY MAYOR SHARKEY: I'll make a 15 second. 16 MAYOR WEINBERG: Okay. Any comments or 17 questions by the Board? 18 TRUSTEE PANG: I do have a question. 19 I note that there was deposit, what, 20 \$15,000 as expense account for village. I 21 want to clarify. 22 For this landmark study, the money, is it 23 coming from that account or is it from the 24 village account?

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MAYOR WEINBERG: The landmark -- Denise. One, I don't know what you're talking about in terms of \$15,000 expense account. The amount of the -- for the consultant, the lump sum bid was \$5,250. The recommendation was to have a "not to exceed" number of \$6,000 in case there is a small cost overrun. Denise, do you know the answer to the question as to under which line item of the budget the consultant would be paid from? VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR KNOWLAND: It would be from the village fund. The \$15,000 expense deposit I think is what Mr. Pang was referring to with regard to the application that was withdrawn. Is that correct, Mr. Pang? Is that what you meant, the \$15,000? TRUSTEE PANG: That's right. Yeah. VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR KNOWLAND: Okay. So it will not be out of that because -- it will be out of the General Fund of the Village of Thomaston.

23TRUSTEE PANG: Okay. Thank you.24MAYOR WEINBERG: Okay. Please understand

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1	that in terms of any request to landmark,
2	that would be an item that would be paid for
3	from the General Fund. That request of
4	course can be made at any time. And at any
5	time the village would be obligated to act
6	and act pursuant to the Landmarks
7	Preservation Commission Code and utilize the
8	Landmarks Preservation Commission. And that
9	would be a village expense.
10	Any other questions or discussion?
11	TRUSTEE WESTON: I mean, I think just to
12	point out. Look. Given the importance of
13	the issue, the (breath) of public interest in
14	the issue, the pending litigation that exists
15	with respect to the original application and
16	the prospect of that in connection with this,
17	I think the having the input of an
18	independent expert is absolutely essential.
19	So I think the expenditure is warranted and
20	in fact in the best interest of the village
21	and of the populace.
22	MAYOR WEINBERG: I think that's and I
23	concur.
24	TRUSTEE MONOSON: I agree.
