RESOLUTION 20-29

Upon motion of Deputy Mayor Sharkey, seconded by Trustee Monoson, and unanimously approved, the following resolution was adopted:

Public Hearing on application of 661 Northern Associates, LLC

RESOLUTION 20-32

WHEREAS, 661 Northern Associates, LLC, as long term lessee of premises 661 Northern Boulevard, Thomaston, also known as Section 2, Block 140, Lot 793 on the Nassau County Land and Tax Map, previously applied to the Board of Trustees of the Village of Thomaston for a certain incentive zoning permit with respect to permitted uses of the foregoing subject property, and

WHEREAS, by Resolution 18-55, duly adopted on June 18, 2018 the Board of Trustees granted incentive zoning relief pursuant to that application, subject to various conditions as stated in the said Resolution 18-55, and

WHEREAS, upon subsequent application, the Board of Trustees duly adopted Resolution 20-12 approving an amendment of the incentive zoning relief previously granted, and

WHEREAS, the applicant subsequently filed application to further amend the aforesaid incentive use permit, and to amend a Declaration of Covenants and Restrictions executed and recorded in relation to such incentive use permit, to allow use of the premises 661 Northern Blvd., Thomaston, New York for signage other than that described in the previously adopted approvals, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to General Municipal Law §239-m the Village of Thomaston has referred this application to the Nassau County Planning Commission for its review and recommendation, and

WHEREAS, the Nassau County Planning Commission has not responded to such referral within the time provided by law and agreement, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees has held and concluded public hearings with respect to the said application as required by law,

WHEREAS, by Resolution 20-31 adopted this date the Board of Trustees, as Lead Agency, has classified this proposed action as a Type II Action which requires no further environmental review, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees hereby finds and determines that the proposed amendment is within the scope of permitted incentives as provided in the Village Code, and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees hereby finds and determines that the proposed amendments would be consistent with the intent of the Village Code incentive zoning legislation, and the approvals heretofore granted in Resolutions 18-55 and 20-12, and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees finds and concludes that the signage proposed by the amendment would be consistent with the character of the neighborhood and community, and would not generate adverse impacts or effects to any degree or type different from those which would result from the previously approved incentive use for the subject property, and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees hereby amends the previously approved incentive zoning permit approval, as previously amended, to permit signage as depicted on "Biener Ford Signage Details, Drawing labeled SP-1, prepared by John F. Capobianco dated February 4, 2020 (the "Signage Plan"), and it is further

RESOLVED, that the applicant is authorized and directed to file an amendment to the Declaration of Covenants required to be recorded pursuant to Resolution 18-55, as amended, in a form bearing the endorsement of the Village Attorney as to form, prior to the issuance of any building permit for construction or alterations at the subject property in furtherance of the authorized incentive use(s), and it is further

RESOLVED, except as modified by this resolution, all terms and conditions of Resolutions 18-55 and 20-12 shall remain in effect.

Proposed Town of North Hempstead Solid Waste Disposal Amendment

The Board discussed the proposed amendment of the Town of North Hempstead Solid Waste Disposal agreement.

RESOLUTION 20-36

Upon motion of Trustee Monoson, seconded by Trustee Weston, and unanimously approved, the following resolution was adopted:

WHEREAS, the Village of Thomaston ("Village"), the Town of North Hempstead ("Town"), and the Town of North Hempstead Solid Waste Management Authority ("Authority"), entered into an Inter-Municipal Agreement ("IMA") as of April 14, 2010 with respect to the disposal of solid waste materials at Authority facilities, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to paragraph A of the IMA, the term of the IMA expires April 30, 2020 unless terminated "pursuant to the opt-out provisions of the Sanitation Code of the Town of North Hempstead (the "Sanitation Code"), or the expiration of the long-term disposal agreement absent exercise of the option period contained therein", and

WHEREAS, the Sanitation Code provides, in Town of North Hempstead Code §46-22, that a Village which is subject to the provisions of the Sanitation Code may exempt itself from such Code by making a declaration of exemption, and

WHEREAS, the Village wishes to terminate the IMA with respect to the Village, and to declare the Village to be exempt from the Sanitation Code, effective as of the close of business on April 30, 2020, and

WHEREAS, the Village heretofore has lawfully entered into contracts for the collection of solid waste from properties in the Village, and disposal of such waste at facilities of the Authority, or other locations as provided by law, and

WHEREAS, upon termination of the IMA and exemption from the Sanitation Code, the Village will continue to make lawful provisions for the collection and disposal of solid waste from properties in the Village on and after May 1, 2020 in accordance with law, and

WHEREAS, prior to May 1, 2020, and prior to entering into any agreements for such collection and disposal of solid waste the Village Board of Trustees will review and consider an Environmental Assessment Form pursuant to the provisions of the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA), and make such classifications and determinations as may be required by SEQRA,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of the Village of Thomaston hereby finds and determines as follows:

- 1. The Village hereby terminates the IMA effective as of the close of business on April 30, 2020;
- 2. The Village hereby declares its exemption from the Sanitation Code, effective as of the close of business on April 30, 2020;
- 3. Pursuant to the provisions of §46-22(B) of the Sanitation Code, the Village hereby further declares and agrees that the Village indemnifies the Town and Authority from responsibility or liability under any applicable New York State law, rule or regulation relating to solid waste collection, disposal or recycling activities conducted or authorized by said Village, including but not limited to New York State Environmental Conservation Law § 27-0107 (Local Solid Waste Management Plans) and 6 NYCRR Part 360, Subpart 15 (Comprehensive Solid Waste Management Planning), and
- 4. The Village Administrator is hereby authorized and directed to forthwith send a copy of this resolution to the Supervisor of the Town of North Hempstead, the Clerk of the Town of North Hempstead, the Town Attorney of the Town of North Hempstead, and the Members and Executive Director of the Town of North Hempstead Solid Waste Management Authority.

Bill T 2020A.

A local law to amend the Code of the Village of Thomaston, in relation to appointment and compensation of experts, clerks and secretary to the board of appeals.

Section one. Section 203-17(B) of the Code of the Village of Thomaston is hereby amended, to read as follows:

"B. A Board of Appeals, consisting of five members, shall be appointed by the Board of Trustees. Each member of the Board of Appeals shall have a term of five official years. The Board of Trustees shall designate one member of the Board of Appeals as the Chairperson of the Board of Appeals, for a term coterminous with the term of such member. In the absence of the Chairperson, the Board of Appeals may designate a member to serve as Acting Chairperson. Subject to the approval of the Board of Trustees, the Mayor may appoint counsel, clerks and/or a secretary for the Board of Appeals; the compensation and terms of employment of such persons shall be established by resolution of the Board of Trustees. Within the appropriations made by the Board of Trustees therefor, the Board of Appeals may retain the services of experts and may provide for such other expenses as may be necessary and proper."

Section two. This local law take effect immediately upon adoption and filing pursuant to the Municipal Home Rule Law.
